VERY IMPORTANT PERSON (VIP)

At home you know that your child is a Very Important Person (VIP). At school we also want to celebrate how special each child is and give them the opportunity to share part of their uniqueness with us.

Each week a different child in every class will be chosen to be the VIP. The child will be given special responsibilities, and sit in the VIP chair that week.

When it is your child's VIP week they will also be given a sheet of paper/card to decorate with special things all about them. This may include: photographs of growing up and special people, special drawings or stories, awards they have collected- anything that shows how important and unique they are. We would like you to encourage and support your child to decorate their poster with felt tip pens or paints, glitter or stickers.... anything they like. The poster should be brought into school on Monday morning to be shared with the class and displayed just outside the classroom door.

This all contributes towards enhancing your child's self esteem and confidence and valuing each child's special qualities.

We look forward to seeing your child's poster. Remember you are all unique; you are **Imago Dei** – made in the image of God – and are loved unconditionally by God.

Please make sure your child is wearing appropriate footwear. All shoes should be completely black with no visible logos. Please **DO**


NOT buy boots of any description or trainers. During the cold and wet weather children may wear boots/wellies to school but will need to change once they are in the building. Thank you.

MAINTENANCE FUND
