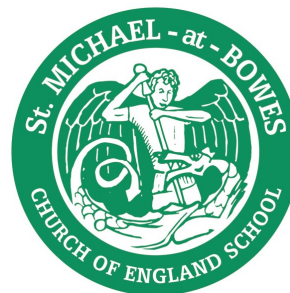




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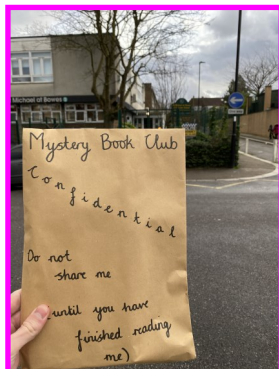

VIRTUAL COFFEE MORNING

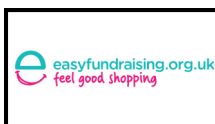

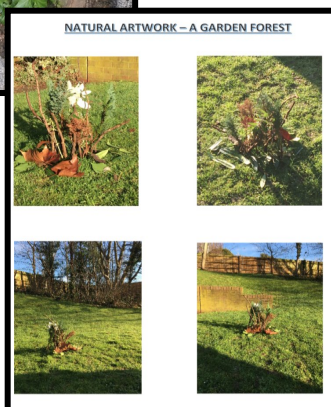
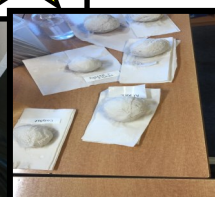
YEAR 3

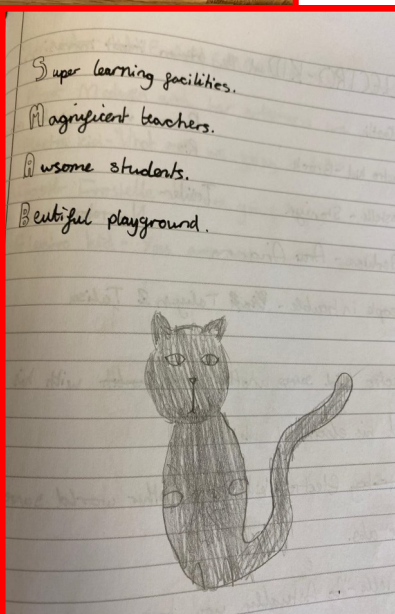
YEAR 4

- screen time should be limited because it is not good for your health.

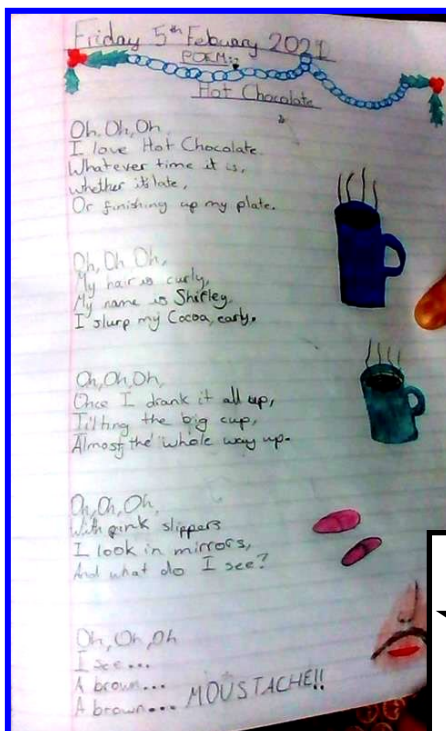
YEAR 5
