### Maths

**Our maths works will include:**

- Area and perimeter and volume
- Time
- Ratio and proportion
- Measure
- Statistics
- **OUR TARGETS FOR THIS TERM ARE:**
- **I can use, read, write and convert between standard unit, converting measurements of length, mass, volume and time using decimal notation up to three decimal places.**
- **Recognise when it is possible to use formulae for area and volume of shapes.**

### Music:

The children will have the opportunity to listen to and learn songs from this particular period.

Have a deeper understanding of the history and context of music. How did music play a part in the war? How did people come together around music? What was music like at the time?

‘The Boy In The Striped Pyjamas’ book will also be used to inspire narrative writing based on the experiences of many children during World War 2.

### Computing:

### SCIENCE

### HISTORY

We will be exploring the causes of various wars and the key events during those wars. We will be paying particular attention to the impact of the Home Front on today’s society.

### Geography

We will be finding out about the countries involved in various wars, identifying their positions on world maps. We will be exploring the geographical features of some of these places. We will also be looking at a few cities in the Northern-Hemisphere as case studies to look at differences in physical and human geography there.
