



PE Pupil Premium Spend 2020/21

St Michael at Bowes has been allocated **£19,210** in funding for PE and Sports Premium for the School year 2020/21. This amount has been sustained at the higher premium amount, in line with last year's allocation, further emphasising the importance PE and Sport nationwide. Therefore, we must redouble our efforts to enable as many children to participate and uncomplicate the process of accessing sports. We must guarantee fulfilment of PE and school sport, fortifying strong links to extra-curricular provision and exposing children to competitive and professional sport. Planting the seeds at this age can create a legacy of healthier and more active round citizens.
