Chat




WhatsApp

WhatsApp is an instant messaging app, which lets you send instant messages, images and videos to friends.




Viber

Viber lets you text, call, share photos and send video messages to people worldwide.




Oovoo

Oovoo is a video chat app. It lets you make video calls, voice calls and send text messages. You can webcam up to 12 people at once.



Tango


Tango is an app which allows you to make voice calls and video calls, and have group chats.



BBM


Blackberry's BBM is an instant messaging app. You have your own 4 digit PIN and other people can only add you using this number.

Kik

Kik is an instant messaging app which lets you share messages, photos, games and news, or organise events.




Hangouts

Google Hangouts is a platform by Google which includes instant messaging, video chat and SMS features.




Messenger

Messenger is an app which allows users to communicate with their friends from their Facebook account or phonebook.



IMO


Message and video chat with your friends and family for free, no matter what device they are on.



Wiper


Wiper is a free messaging service. Texting you can erase from your friends' phones, plus encrypted messages.

Video




Skype

Skype is a computer programme and app, which lets you make audio and video calls to friends and family.




Vine

Vine is an app that lets you share 6 second videos that play on a loop. You can repost videos and leave comments.



Omegle


Talk to Strangers! Omegle connects you randomly to another person who's on the site, and lets you talk to them in a one-to-one video chat.



Facetime


Facetime is video calls over Wi-Fi from your iPhone, iPad, iPod touch or Mac. You can even make FaceTime calls over mobile networks on iPhone or iPad.

Video (Music)




Dubsmash

Dubsmash is a mobile app where users can choose an audio recording or soundbite from movies, shows, music, and internet trends and record a video of themselves dubbing over that piece of audio.




Video Star

Video Star is a great app for teens who want to create original music videos.



Triller


Triller is a music video maker app for iPhone. Pick a song, select the portion of the song you want to use, snap a few takes, and with the tap of a button you have a celebrity-quality music video.



Musical.ly


Musical.ly is a video community that allows you to create, share, and discover short videos.

Video (Live Streaming)




Live.ly

Live.ly is a new live video streaming platform created by musical.ly. You can start a live.ly to broadcast to your fans and friends, and have real-time interactions




Twitch

Twitch is a live video game website. You can watch playbacks of games being played by other people. You can also live stream your own games, and chat to other gamers.




Periscope

Owned by Twitter, Periscope is a live video streaming app. Allows you to send direct live video feeds to your Twitter followers.

On You Now you can tap 'Go Live' and you're on! Broadcast to a live audience, expand your social media following, comment on videos and buy virtual gifts.



Live.me


Live.me is a live video streaming app. Allowing you to broadcast and watch live chat. Join in discussions with YouTubers and Musical.ly stars...

Social Networks




Facebook

Facebook is the biggest social network, which lets users create a page about themselves.




Huggle

Huggle allows you to discover and connect with others who frequent the same places as you. See the places you have in common. Share photos, videos and start chatting...




Kiwi

Kiwi is a fast and easy way to ask your friends interesting questions and find out what they think.



Yubl


Yubl is Social Network that allows you to see your friends location live. Send photos, videos and chat. Yubl's unique Canvas chat is it's most appealing feature...



Twitter


Twitter is a social network messaging service that lets you send public message called 'tweets'.

Social Networks (Pictures)




Snapchat

Snapchat is an app that lets you send a photo or short video to your friends. The 'snap' appears on screen for a matter of seconds before disappearing.




Fling

Fling allows you to you meet new people around the world. With Fling, your photos, videos and text send to 50-500 people's feeds.




PopJam

PopJam is a creative website for children and young people. You can share drawings, photos and audio messages with friends and other people.



Yovo

Yovo is a way to create a story using live shots or photos from your library. Then after 48 hours it simply disappears forever.



Instagram

Instagram is a picture and video sharing app. Users can post content and use hashtags to share experiences, thoughts or memories with an online community.

Anonymous




Ask.fm

Ask.fm is a social networking site where you can ask other people questions. It's up to you whether you want to ask the question anonymously or not.




Whisper

Whisper is a social network where you can remain anonymous, publish text and receive replies from other people. It also allows you to communicate with others through private messages.



Secret


Secret is a social networking app where you can post content or content anonymously.



Yik Yak


Yik Yak is an online bulletin board. It uses the GPS schools on your mobile phone or tablet to find your location and show you the most recent posts from other people around you.

Online Dating




Tinder

Tinder is a dating app, which used to have two separate communities - one for adults (18+) and one for young people aged 13-17. But this was changed in June 2016. You swipe left for 'no' or right for 'yes'.




MeetMe

MeetMe is a which asocial network and dating site and allows users to meet and communicate with other people worldwide.



Snog

Snog is a teen dating site that lets you rate other people's profiles as snog, marry or avoid. You can also send private messages.



MyLOL


MyLOL is a dating site for teenagers aged 13-20, but some users are up to 25 years old. Like an adult dating site, you can view other people's profiles and search for others based on their age, gender and location.

Secret Folders




Calculator%

Calculator% hides private photos and videos behind a calculator. Anyone who starts this application looks as a calculator but if you put in passcode it will open up private area.




Private Photo Vault

Private Photo Vault locks your photos and videos behind a pin. Keeps your photos etc. hidden from others.




Secret Folder App

Secret Folder App helps you to protect your photos and. No one can enter except those who know the passcode.



Piano

Secret Piano hides photos, videos, passwords, notes, audios, locations and secret messages behind a real piano. The app will capture photo of intruders if they attempt to access it.



CYBERBULLYING

cyberbullying


Cyberbullying is when someone bullies others over the internet or on a mobile phone by sending abusive emails or texts directly or by posting nasty comments or humiliating images for others to see. Like any form of bullying, cyberbullying can be horrible for the children involved and hard for them to talk about.

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year

No safe place, hard to escape

Doesn't empathise with victim


Easily shared with an audience and has the ability to go viral in seconds



Bully can be anonymous

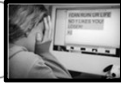

What should I do if my child is being bullied online?



Stay calm
Listen without judging
Tell them you can help
Keep the evidence
Praise them for talking to you
Ask them not to reply
Block the bullies

Child Exploitation Online Protection Centre (CEOP)

How do offenders engage youngsters?
- by using the sites that they use....



Often posing as
a child of the same age / gender.
They will often purposefully present a very
similar profile as the child.
They are skilled at manipulating them into
criminal sexual relationships

Online grooming: The five stages

Friendship

Flattering a child

into talking in a private
chatroom/game where
they will be isolated

The child will often be
asked for a **non-sexual**
picture of themselves

Online grooming: The five stages

Forming a relationship

Gaining information

asking the child what problems
/needs they have to create the
illusion of being their
best friend and that they can help
They begin to fill the needs of the
child

Online grooming: The five stages

Risk assessment

Asking the child about
**the location of their
computer/tablet and who
else has access to it**

in order to assess the risk of
being detected. The desire is to
**create situations where
they are alone together**
to help reinforce a
special connection

Online grooming: The five stages

Exclusivity

Building up a sense of *mutual love and trust with the child* suggesting that they can discuss "anything"

Online grooming: The five stages

Sex talk / Meet

Engaging the child in explicit conversations & requesting sexually explicit pictures from them

At this stage the predator will usually try to

arrange a meeting with the child

Breck Bednar - 14 years old -

Murdered after being groomed by 19 year old Lewis Daynes
- on gaming sites like 'Minecraft'



14 Year Old Girl
abducted and abused
for four days
by David Telles (38 years)
flew over from California.
She was groomed on
'Clash of Clans'



SEXTING

Children who post or send indecent images of themselves online are **very easily**

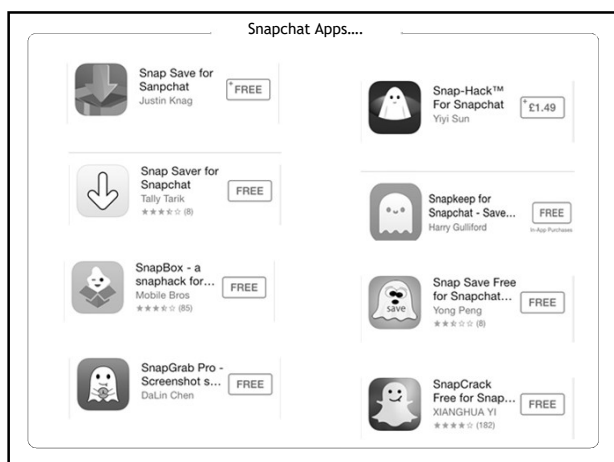

Kids 'sext' to....
 show off

By creating, sending or possessing indecent pictures of a **person under 18** you are **breaking the law**
 (Protection of Children Act 1978 / Criminal Justice Act 1988) ...




Police have only recently started filing crime reports about sexting...


If school choose to take an incident to the police, then officers must record the crime.



Step 1 - Go to safety preferences




Simply go to the bottom of any page on YouTube™ and click the grey 'Safety' button to open the preference setting.

Step 2 - Turn Safety Mode 'on' or 'off'




Choose to turn Safety Mode 'on' or 'off' and click on Save. If you turn it on and you have a YouTube™/Google account, you can sign in to your account and lock Safety Mode so that no-one else can change the settings whenever YouTube™ is accessed from that browser.

Ratings and content
These settings let you restrict games and video content based on the content's rating. You can also set whether or not unrated or explicit content can be played on this console. You can even set up exceptions for individual games that are outside of the rating restrictions you have set.

Family Timer
This setting allows you to limit the time that your console can be used on a daily or weekly basis.

Xbox LIVE access
This setting allows you to decide if your family can connect to Xbox LIVE from this console. Membership of Xbox LIVE enables you to do things like rent films and play games against other people online.

Restrict game content

- 1 Go to 'Settings' then scroll to 'Security Settings'.
- 2 The default password is 0000 but you can change this under the 'Change Password' option by following the on-screen instructions.
- 3 Select 'Parental Controls'; enter your password.
- 4 You can now choose the game content you're comfortable letting your family access. The lower the number, the stricter the settings:

- 2 – Early Childhood
- 3 – Everyone
- 4 – Everyone 10 and up
- 5 – Teen
- 9 – Mature
- 10 – Adults Only

5 From 'Parental Controls' you can also block access to online play by toggling 'Internet Browser Start Control' to 'On'.
