Thank you to all parents who returned their questionnaire this year. We received 69 responses in total. The responses were overwhelmingly positive, which is wonderful to hear, but we will be acting promptly to address any issues brought to our attention. We have collated the information you gave us and the results are presented for your information below.

From the comments received and the percentages above, the school will be taking the following action to address parent/carer views:

- Taking steps to ensure that Parent Consultation meetings run to time so parents are not waiting too long to see their child's class teacher. Please also support us with this by keeping to time and not arriving late for your appointment.
- Uploading more video footage to the school website, including advice on how to support your child with their learning at home.
- Exploring the possibility of running more after school clubs that are not sport related. Unfortunately, as budgets and workloads are already stretched, it is unlikely that we will be able to offer additional free clubs.
- Trying to arrange a meeting with the Local Authority regarding the school dinner menu, to give parents an opportunity to express their views directly to them.

We are pleased to see that so many parents do not know if the school is effective in dealing with behaviour issues, as this indicates that their child has not needed to access support for this.

We would encourage parents to visit the website regularly as most important information about the school can be found there and can be translated into several different languages via a button at the bottom of the Home page.

Thank you for taking the time to complete this questionnaire. The feedback you give us will help the school improve and maintain standards.
