

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## 'JOURNEYS' SCIENCE WEEK AT SMAB

Exploring electricity

Last week we held a very successful science week based around the theme of journeys. Classes learned about pollution, the role of bees in the journey of life and scientific explorers during lessons. For the whole school competition all children were asked to find ten terrific scientific journeys and one of those journeys in detail.

On Tuesday, Professor Paul from Professor Bubbleworks, visited the school, led whole school assembly (the fire tornado brought down the house!) and ran a series of workshops for all lower school classes. They learned how to make lava lamps and slime and explored how they could be part of an electrical circuit!

Throughout the week, classes were designing and making a vehicle that would carry an egg over a long distance without damaging the egg. The designs were all great and used a variety of scientific methods to power them. Several of the vehicles were unsuccessful on the day but the learning and cooperation involved was invaluable.



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
