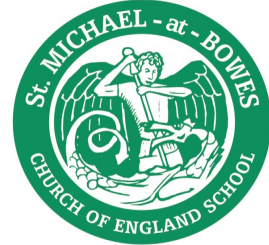

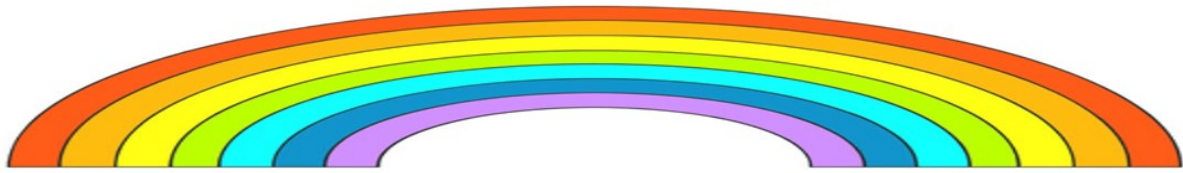

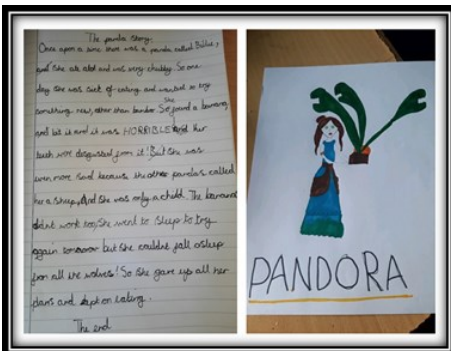
## YEAR 3

**Aden in 3S** has been making great efforts to complete learning tasks. This week Aden has drawn 2D shapes and created 3D shapes.



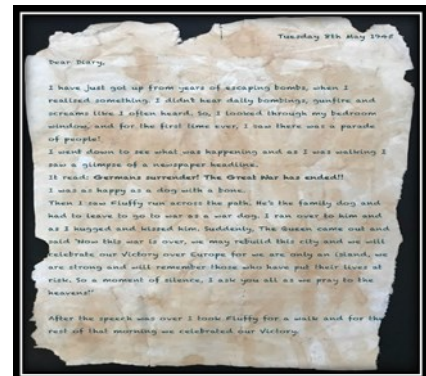

## YEAR 4

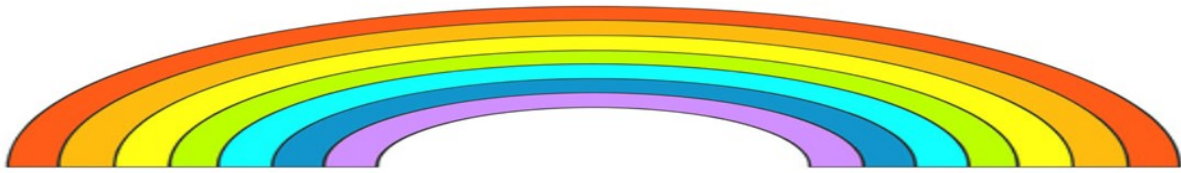


**Matilda (4H)** has been working really hard this week and has written her own version of the Ancient Greek myth Pandora's Box including a lovely drawing too.

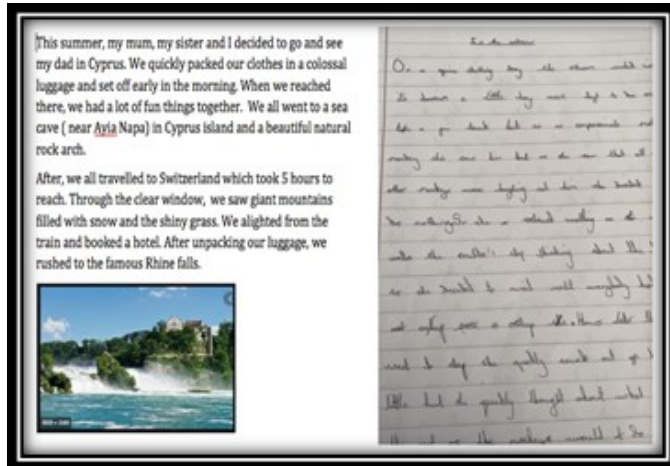

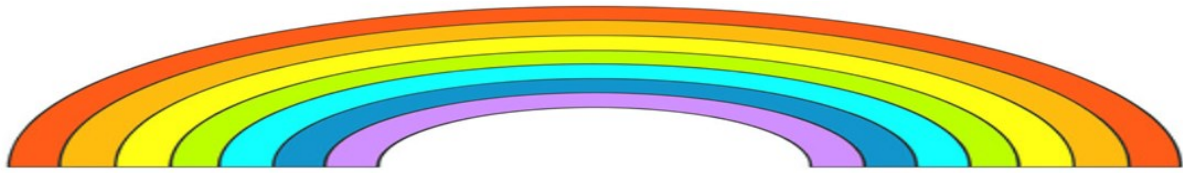
**Ioanni (5E)** designed his own tapestry inspired by the Bayeux Tapestry.

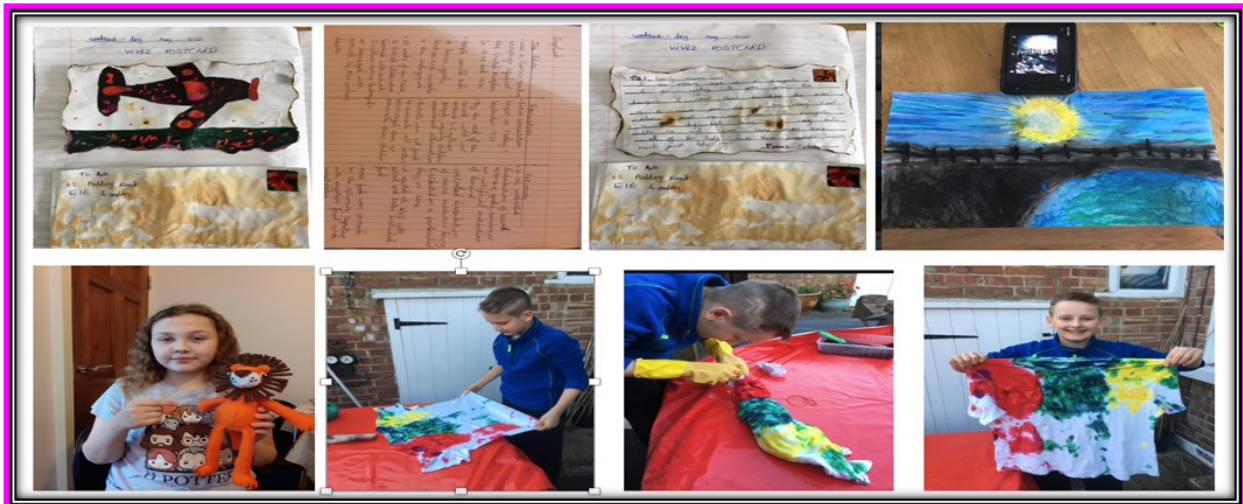
