
Family-friendly days out in London



- 1. **Be amazed at the <u>Natural History Museum</u>:**Meet a roaring T-Rex and feel the ground shake on the earthquake simulator
- 2. **Step into the past at the <u>Ragged School</u> Museum:** See what life was like for the poor and destitute children of London's East End during the late 1800s.
- 3. **Enjoy seafaring tales at the <u>National Maritime</u> Museum:** Stoke the boiler of a steamship in the AHOY! Children's gallery.
- 4. **Spend hours at the <u>British Museum</u>**: Be wowed by the Rosetta Stone and Egyptian mummies.
- 5. **Time travel at the <u>Museum of London</u>**: Walk through the streets of Victorian London, head back to Roman times or explore the modern-day city.
- 6. **Get interactive at the <u>Science Museum</u>**: Spot space rockets and giant steam engines, and enjoy hands-on activities.
- 7. **Learn about London's trade at the Museum of London Docklands:** Step into Sailortown, a reconstruction of 19th-century London.
- 8. **Find quirky exhibits at the <u>Wellcome Collection</u>**: Discover Napoleon's toothbrush and Darwin's walking stick.

- Unwind in <u>Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park</u>: Splash about in the fountains and let them loose in the playgrounds.
- Play at the <u>Diana Princess of Wales Memorial</u>
 <u>Playground</u>: Climb the wooden pirate ship or commandeer a teepee.
- 3. **Meet life-size dinosaurs in <u>Crystal Palace Park</u>**: You'll also find a children's farm, maze and playground.
- 4. **Enjoy an afternoon at <u>Coram's Fields</u>**: This park and playground has a small animal area, cafe and paddling pool.
- 5. Cool off at <u>Granary Square</u>: This traffic-free square in King's Cross has fountains where jets change colour and squirt in patterns.





Animal attractions in London

- 1. **Explore the** Horniman Museum and Gardens: Meet the gigantic overstuffed walrus and more weird and wonderful exhibits.
- 2. **Meet animals at <u>Mudchute Farm and Park</u>**: Feed the cows and more at London's largest urban park.
- 3. **Head to Vauxhall City Farm:** Marvel at the funky hairstyles of its three famous alpacas, Tom, Jerry and Ben.
- 4. **Say hi to the residents at** <u>Deen City Farm and Riding School</u>: Take home some farm produce after the little ones have played with the animals.
- 5. **Time your visit to <u>St James's Park</u>**: Watch the pelicans being fed every day at 2.30pm, while keeping your eyes peeled for water birds, owls, pelicans and bats too.
- 6. **Go pond dipping at <u>Camley Street Natural Park</u>**: You can also spot birds and butterflies at this King's Cross wildlife haven.

Forty Hall Forty Hill, London, EN2 9HA Country house with interactive activities, Farm entrance fee - adult's £2 children free of charge, children's adventure playground and acres of land to walk and hike.

Lea Valley Park You can cycle along the tow path from Hertfordshire right into London and there are camping sites availability at a number of sections of the park. There are also historical activities at Waltham Abbey. There are numerous picnic areas all along the river Lea.

Trent Park Cockfosters Road, Enfield, Barnet, EN4 OPS There is a wildlife reserve with a range of rescued animals, there are picnic areas, there is a large children's climbing frame and café. There are acres of land through which to hike and walk with ponds/lakes to explore.

Dugdale 39 London Road, Enfield, EN3 6DS Houses the Enfield Museum – providing a view into Enfield's past. Dugdale Centre also has an Art Gallery and a café.
